

Thank you for making 2024 an incredible year for Student Startup! Because of your support, we are on track for a record-breaking year with nearly 150 students impacted on their entrepreneurial journey of business/personal growth.

Your generosity has fueled incredible successes featured in this report. Lives are changing by pairing mentoring with productivity. This is upstream work, and we're learning that through partnerships with like minded organizations we can go even further upstream by investing in the families of students we serve and helping connect them with economic opportunity and spiritual support.

One of my favorite stories from 2024 is a student from South High who completed the Raising Men program and is now growing his business with the help of his mentor from Student Startup who gives him rides to his customer's properties most weeks. One Saturday, they were discussing the importance of shopping for healthy and affordable food when the student revealed his family didn't have a refrigerator. The team was then able to connect the family with the Build & Rebuild community center near their house which is a referring agent of Care Portal and within 48 hours a fridge was delivered from a local church. Build & Rebuild's ministry is now connecting this student's mother to life-changing empowerment programming they offer for adults. This is the power of partnership, impacting entire families, not just kids.

Looking ahead, we're excited to complete our capital campaign project to scale the program to other cities through our new tech platform. This project is already bringing results and has led to a growing partnership with the Wichita Public Schools who recently purchased fifty licenses of our online startup business program. This week alone we have recruiting visits booked at three of their high schools.

To finish the year in the black we need to raise \$38,000 which will help set the stage for future growth. Because of our belief in Student Startup's operating team and strategy, my family is planning to make our largest gift yet, and we invite you to join us.



From Mowing Lawns to Building Apps:

Isaac Graves, a Student Startup participant for multiple years, is now a freshman at K-State studying business. While he once mowed lawns through the program, Isaac has since embarked on a new entrepreneurial adventure: developing an exercise logbook app called Lift Tracer Workouts.

Designed for gym enthusiasts and beginners alike, the app helps users track their progress over time, learn about weightlifting, and even provides an Al coach to answer questions about exercises, meal plans, and workout routines. Isaac's journey into app development began with an IT/Business mentor provided through Student Startup. With guidance and online courses, he turned to tools like OpenAl to learn coding from scratch, creating a functional app in just two and a half months.

Beyond his entrepreneurial pursuits, Isaac's faith is central to his life. While he grew up with some exposure to church, it wasn't until high school through connections at Student Startup that he began asking deeper questions about faith. Inspired by his mentors, Isaac came to embrace Jesus as Lord and Savior and is now actively involved in campus Bible studies.

Isaac's passion for growth extends beyond business. "Why would I do anything if it's not to glorify God?" he says. His journey of learning—both spiritually and professionally—shows how deeply intertwined faith and entrepreneurship can be. Isaac's story is a powerful example of how curiosity, mentorship, and dedication can lead to growth in every aspect of life.




